ABOUT SCHOLARSHIPS AND BURSARIES

In 2019, Sancta will be awarding a number of scholarships and bursaries to **postgraduate women and men**, and **undergraduate women**, to enable them to live at Sancta whilst studying in Sydney.

Scholarships and bursaries have enabled thousands of deserving young women and men to live at Sancta and not only benefit from, but contribute to, the academically inspiring and socially fulfilling environment that our Founders set out to create.

Our scholarship offering is broad and aims to attract and retain talented, ambitious students who will contribute to our culture of excellence and community. We believe in the potential of all students and wish to remove barriers such as financial difficulty and location where possible.

Students fitting one or more of the below criteria are encouraged to review our available scholarships in 2019:

- Academic high performers
- Students with financial need
- Students with exceptional talent in sport / creative and performing arts / debating and oration and other cultural endeavours
- Medicine students
- Law students
- STEM (Science/Engineering/Technology/Mathematics) students
- Arts students
- Veterinary Science/Agriculture/Sustainability students
- Students with a genuine commitment to social justice and/or to the spiritual life of the College
- Students exhibiting strong leadership skills and the capacity to contribute positively to the culture of Sancta

Applying for scholarships

Returning/current students

Bursaries

Bursaries are awarded to new or returning students at the discretion of the College and may be offered at any time of the year. Where a new student is not successful in applying for a scholarship, they may be considered for a bursary based on significant financial need.

In 2018, 20 students were supported with bursaries, easing financial pressures that were affecting their application to study, College life and in some cases their ability to continue residing at Sancta.

Bursaries are granted on a per year basis and are valued at \$2,000 in remission of fees.

Supporting documentation

Required supporting documentation may include personal and academic references, family and personal financial information and in some cases, portfolios or media items.

Where financial need is a stated criterion for a scholarship, failure to submit relevant information will render the application void for the purposes of assessment for those scholarships.

Selection process

- A scholarship panel consisting of four members of Sancta Sophia College's Executive staff (including the Principal) review all applications for scholarships and bursaries and create shortlists.
- The panel makes decisions regarding the awarding of College-funded scholarships in consultation with Sancta's Business Office and the College Council.
- Decisions regarding the awarding of private donor scholarships are made in consultation with scholarship donors themselves.

Payment of scholarships

Scholarships are paid on a semester basis towards students' residential fees. All scholarships are reviewed at the end of each semester to ensure adherence to conditions. A scholarship may be withdrawn on the basis of that review or at any other time at the discretion of the scholarships panel.

- The College reserves the right to split a scholarship between two or more candidates and to make no offers if there are no appropriate candidates in particular contexts.
- Applicants are encouraged to give thorough detail regarding their achievements, financial circumstances, talents, passions and leadership experiences so that the panel can consider them for all applicable scholarships.
- Not every scholarship is awarded each year.
- The College reserves the right to cancel or discontinue a scholarship or bursary based on discretionary circumstances or unsatisfactory reviews of recipient adherence to scholarship conditions.

Scholarship criteria include one or more of the following:

- Academic merit - school or university results
- Financial need (measured and defined in a number of different ways and may be based on factors such as family financial circumstances, student self-funding or significant academic demand preventing part-time work)
- Capacity to contribute to the community life of the College (academic, cultural, liturgical, social justice, sporting)
- Leadership experiences and skills

SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE IN 2019

Entrance Scholarships for academic high performers

Scholarship value:

- Up to \$2,500 remission of residential fees per year
- Tenable for the duration of degree undertaken whilst living at Sancta (subject to review of student progress each semester)

Scholarship criteria:

- Commencing Undergraduate or Postgraduate female or male student
- Excellent results in the Higher School Certificate or Undergraduate degree (or equivalent; standards are set once results are released in the year preceding entry)
- Demonstrated potential to contribute to the College community as evidenced in application and appropriate references

Scholarship conditions:

- Maintain a Distinction average (may differ according to field of study)
- Remain enrolled in your course on a full-time basis
- Remain a resident at Sancta Sophia College
- Continue to contribute to the College community through participation and involvement in the life of Sancta (for example, competing in sporting or cultural events; attending Mass and supporting social justice initiatives)

A number of Entrance Scholarships are awarded each year to encourage ambitious scholars to join the Sancta community and contribute to our culture of academic excellence. The scholarships are named after the following benefactors: Barbara Arnold, Olive Arnold, Giselle Dulieu, Lady Fairfax and Rosemary Morrow.

Excellence and Participation Scholarships for students who will lead the community through genuine participation and involvement

Scholarship value:

- Up to \$2,000 remission of residential fees per year
- May be awarded for one year or made tenable for the duration of degree; subject to review each semester

Scholarship criteria:

- Returning male or female student at undergraduate or postgraduate level
- Demonstrated talent in, or passion for, one or more aspects of Sancta life; including but not limited to academic excellence, sport, creative and performing arts, social justice, student leadership and social roles
- Demonstrated capacity to contribute to the College community as evidenced in application and involvement in Sancta life in the preceding year

Scholarship conditions:

- Maintain a sound academic record (standard may vary according to field of study)
- Continue to reside at Sancta Sophia College
- Continue to actively and positively participate in College life by involvement in, and support for academic, cultural, sporting and social activities

Excellence and Participation Scholarships recognise returning students who have achieved excellent academic results whilst also demonstrating commitment to the College through participation in a range of Sancta and intercollegiate activities, as well as assuming either official or unofficial leadership roles within the community.

Creative and Performing Arts / Cultural Contribution Scholarships for students who will add to the cultural richness of the College community

Scholarship value:

- Up to \$2,000 remission of residential fees per year
- Tenable for the time that the student remains at Sancta (subject to review of student progress each semester)

Scholarship criteria:

- Commencing and returning students at undergraduate and postgraduate level
- Demonstrated talent in one or more realms of the creative and performing arts or passion for and strong commitment to other cultural endeavours such as social justice, debating and public speaking
- Genuine commitment and contribution to the College community, including participation in Intercollege competitions and initiatives in your realms of talent and passion

Scholarship conditions:

- Maintain a satisfactory academic record
- Continue to contribute to the Sancta community by using your talent or passion to represent Sancta in Intercollege and university initiatives and competitions
- Continue to reside at Sancta Sophia College

Sancta Sophia College offers scholarships for those with talent in performance and artistic endeavours, such as music, dance, drama, debating and oration. We also value the impact that students with a passion for social justice can have on the culture of our College and encourage such students to become involved in this aspect of College life. The College has an active choir, several ensembles and talented musicians, dancers, actors and artists in residence and is looking to strengthen and consolidate the cultural aspect of College life by providing

scholarships in these areas. There is an expectation that scholars actively participate in these aspects of College life.

Sporting Contribution Scholarships for students with talent in Sport

Scholarship value:

- Up to \$2,000 remission of residential fees per year
- Tenable for the time that the student remains at Sancta (subject to review of student progress each semester)

Scholarship criteria:

- Commencing undergraduate or postgraduate male or female students
- Demonstrated capacity to represent Sancta at InterCollege level or above as a team member, individual athlete or coach/manager
- Genuine commitment to contribute to the College community and be a leader in sport at Sancta

Scholarship conditions:

- Remain a resident at Sancta Sophia College
- Continue commitment to Sport by representing Sancta in relevant competitions as an athlete, coach and supporter
- Maintain a satisfactory academic record

The College has many sporting teams and opportunities to represent the College, and is looking to strengthen and consolidate the sporting aspect of College life by providing scholarships in these areas. There is an expectation that scholars actively participate in these aspects of College life. Sporting scholarships may be held in conjunction with other academic or extracurricular scholarships.

Foundation Scholarships for academic high performers and leaders

Scholarship value:

- Up to 50% remission of residential fees per year
- May be awarded for one year or made tenable for up to three years; subject to review each semester

Scholarship criteria:

- Commencing or returning Undergraduate or Postgraduate female or male student
- Excellent results in the Higher School Certificate or Undergraduate degree (or equivalent; standards are set once results are released in the year preceding entry)
- Demonstrated potential to contribute to the College community as evidenced in application and appropriate references

Scholarship conditions:

- Maintain a Distinction average in your degree (may differ according to field of study)
- Remain enrolled in the degree on a full-time basis
- Continue to contribute to the Sancta Sophia College community
- Remain a resident at Sancta Sophia College

The funds for this scholarship are provided by the Sancta Sophia College Foundation to attract and retain students with exceptional ability to inspire academic excellence at Sancta, as well as lead and support their peers and the broader Sancta community through participation and leadership at Sancta.

House Committee Scholarship for regional or rural Australian undergraduate women

Scholarship value:

- The scholarship amount is allocated by the incoming House Committee (undergraduate student leaders) at the commencement of the new academic year
- Awarded for one academic year; subject to review each semester

Scholarship criteria:

- Commencing undergraduate student from a rural or regional area
- Genuine intention to participate in the spiritual, sporting, cultural and/or general aspects of the College
- Financial need

This scholarship is generously supported by the Students' Association of the College and is available to a new student from a regional or rural area who demonstrates strong leadership capacity and has a genuine intention to participate in the spiritual, sporting, cultural and/or general aspects of the College. The student must be able to demonstrate financial need.

PRIVATE DONOR SCHOLARSHIPS

JT Clark Rural Sustainability Scholarship for undergraduate regional Australian women studying science

Scholarship value:

- 50% remission of fees annually
- Tenable for the time that the student remains at Sancta (subject to review of student progress each semester)

Scholarship criteria:

- Commencing female undergraduate from regional or rural Australia
- Financial need
- Undertaking a Bachelor's degree at **The University of Sydney** in a science or medicine related field (preferably Veterinary Science)

Scholarship conditions:

The progress of the recipient will be reviewed each semester and is subject to cancellation where requirements are not being met. To continue to receive the scholarship support, the student must:

- Remain enrolled on a full-time basis in the science related course
- Maintain a Credit average
- Continue to reside at Sancta Sophia College

Rachel Launders (a Sancta alumna and celebrated corporate lawyer) and her husband Paul Clark named this scholarship after their beloved dog, JT. They are passionate about veterinary science and other science and medicine related fields and want to support regional undergraduate women to study and live in Sydney whilst undertaking such degrees.

Catanzariti - Oppermann Scholarship for regional Australian undergraduate women in STEM (Science/Technology/Engineering/Mathematics)

Scholarship value:

1st year at Sancta: Fee remission of \$10,000

2nd year at Sancta: Fee remission of \$5,000

3rd year at Sancta: Fee remission of \$5,000

*4th year at Sancta: Where the degree is a four-year full-time course (eg. double degree), an additional \$5,000 in fee remission will be given in the fourth year.

Scholarship criteria:

- Commencing female undergraduate from regional or rural Australia
- Undertaking a Bachelor's degree at **The University of Sydney** or **University of Technology Sydney** in one of the following areas:
 - Engineering
 - Information Technology / Data Science
 - Science
 - Mathematics
- Financial need (without significant financial support, they would be unable to attend University and College in Sydney)

Scholarship conditions:

The progress of the recipient will be reviewed each semester and is subject to cancellation where requirements are not being met. To continue to receive the scholarship support, the student must:

- Remain enrolled on a full-time basis in the STEM related course
- Maintain a Credit average
- Continue to reside at Sancta Sophia College

Double degree and double-major students will be considered where at least one of their degrees/majors are based in the above areas.

Therese Catanzariti and Dr Ian Opperman are passionate advocates for women in STEM and they strongly believe that talented young people from regional Australia should be supported in order to access high quality tertiary education. Therese, originally from Griffith, lived at Sancta whilst completing her Law degree in the late 1980s and continues to celebrate an impressive career as a barrister in NSW. She wants other young women from regional and rural towns to be supported to access the same opportunities that she did whilst studying in Sydney and living at Sancta Sophia College. Dr Opperman's career has seen him work across several areas of STEM internationally, working on high-impact projects as an engineer and currently as Chief Data Scientist for the NSW Government. As a leader in Data Science, Ian knows first-hand the importance of encouraging women to explore careers in STEM, acknowledging the positive impact that more women in STEM is having on research and outcomes for governments, NGOs and businesses.

Patricia Horsley Scholarship for graduate students who will lead and inspire the Graduate House community

Scholarship value:

- 50% remission of residential fees annually
- May be awarded for one year only or for the duration of residency at Sancta; continuation is subject to review each semester

Scholarship criteria:

- Female or male postgraduate student
- Strong leadership skills and capacity to contribute to College life, evidenced through application information and appropriate references

Scholarship conditions:

- Maintain a Credit average
- Continue to display genuine commitment to the College community

Patricia Horsley, an alumna of Sancta Sophia College established this scholarship to support Sancta students at Postgraduate level, recognising the value of strong leadership within the Postgraduate student body for the benefit of the entire Sancta community.

Dr Janette Sullivan Scholarship for Medicine students with financial need

Scholarship value:

- 50% remission of residential fees
- May be awarded for one year only or for the duration of residency at Sancta; continuation is subject to review each semester

Scholarship criteria:

- Male or female commencing domestic student
- Undertaking a Medicine degree in Sydney
- Financial need

Scholarship conditions:

- Maintain a sound academic record
- Maintain a strong commitment and contribution to the College community

Dr Janette (nee Harris) Sullivan, an alumna of Sancta (Fresher 1964) and scholarship recipient, recalls how the generosity of others enabled her to come to College and pursue her ambition to become a doctor. She credits the impact that Sancta's staff and her network of supportive peers empowered her to excel in her studies and complete her medical degree at The University of Sydney despite its low pass rate (and even lower pass rate for women) at the time. Dr Sullivan wants to give the same gift of the Sancta experience to other deserving students who would otherwise struggle or be unable to attend College and study in Sydney.

Sr Mary Shanahan Scholarship for students who demonstrate a balanced approach to studies, social life and spirituality

Scholarship value:

- 50% remission of residential fees
- May be awarded for one year or more; continuation subject to review each semester

Scholarship criteria:

- Commencing or returning student at undergraduate or postgraduate level
- Demonstration of a balanced approach to all of: studies, social life and spirituality (see below for further detail)

Scholarship conditions:

- Maintain a serious focus on studies and continue the pursuit of knowledge including obtaining satisfactory results in your full-time degree
- Continue to actively contribute to the Sancta Sophia College community across all areas of the scholarship criteria
- Remain a resident at Sancta Sophia College

Sr Mary Shanahan was a student at Sancta Sophia College during her first degree; she was later Vice Principal of the College and then served as Principal for a number of years. A much-loved leader of the Sancta community, Sr Shanahan continues to have a profound impact on alumni, current and past students and staff of the College. This Scholarship pays tribute to Sr Shanahan's enduring contribution to the College and the lives of many students who lived at Sancta during her time here.

Sr Shanahan has been instrumental in framing the terms of the Scholarship so that it captures and reflects her approach as Principal of the College. The emphasis is 'balance'. The applicants for the scholarship will need to demonstrate a balanced approach to:

Studies: The applicants should be serious in their approach to their studies though they are not required to be achieving high academic honours. They should enjoy the pursuit of knowledge per se and experience a breadth of subject matter and have wide interests.

Social life: This aspect includes contribution to and support for College life, with caring for their fellow students at Sancta a key aspect. Sr Shanahan recognises that College days are an important time for students to grow and mature.

Spirituality: This aspect considers spirituality in a broad sense and includes social justice. The applicants should show an interest in continuing to develop their understanding of their faith of whatever denomination, challenging themselves as well as reflecting on wider social and spiritual issues.

Pam Suttor Scholarship for regional and rural women studying Law

Scholarship value:

- \$5,000 remission of residential fees annually
- \$500 bursary for books and materials
- Tenable for up to three years; subject to review each semester

Scholarship criteria:

- Commencing rural or regional student
- Undertaking a Law degree (preferably at The University of Sydney)
- Financial need (without significant financial support, they would be unable to attend University and College in Sydney)

- Demonstrated capacity to contribute to the College through genuine participation and involvement

Scholarship conditions:

- Maintain a sound academic record
- Continue to contribute to the College community through genuine participation and involvement

Pam Suttor is an alumna of Sancta and a successful lawyer who moved from her regional town to Sydney in order to study at The University of Sydney. She wants to support ambitious regional women who aim to practise law in the future. The scholarship also includes \$500 towards books and materials through the support of another alumna and lawyer, Therese Catanzariti.

John Lane Mullins Scholarship for undergraduate and postgraduate students with an application to the Arts and Faith

Scholarship value:

- \$6,000 remission of fees per year
- May be awarded for one year or more; subject to review each semester

Scholarship criteria:

- Commencing or returning domestic undergraduate or postgraduate student
- Undertaking study in the Arts and Social Sciences
- An interest and passion for Australian history, literature, fine arts, music or politics
- Support of Sancta's catholic identity and a commitment to participate in liturgical and social justice activities

Scholarship conditions:

- Maintain a Credit average in your course
- Continue to demonstrate an ongoing commitment and contribution to College life through genuine participation and involvement
- Continue to display genuine support for, and involvement in, the liturgical and social justice activities of the College

The John Lane Mullins Scholarship was established in 2016 in recognition of Lane Mullins' philanthropic support and legacy towards Sancta. It was awarded for the first time in 2017. During his lifetime, John Lane Mullins (1857-1939), a great supporter of Sancta Sophia College, donated part of his collection of books to the College. Following his death, the remainder of his library of books on Australian history and exploration, and Australian literature was left by his four daughters to the College. In 2015, the College Council approved the sale of the books and the proceeds from the endowment for this scholarship.

The terms of the scholarship recognise John Lane Mullins' career, interests and patronage. It is awarded to students (current or newly entering) who are engaged in the study of Australian history, literature, fine arts, music or politics. Lane Mullins was a significant supporter of the Catholic Church, so evidence of the applicant's Catholic faith may determine the chosen scholar.

Mary Smoker Scholarship for community-minded undergraduate women who will lead and inspire

Scholarship value:

- \$10,000 remission of fees per year
- Tenable for the duration of degree undertaken whilst living at Sancta (subject to review of student progress each semester)

Scholarship criteria:

- Commencing undergraduate student
- Undertaking a Bachelor degree at The University of Sydney
- Financial need
- Demonstrated commitment to participate in College life and contribute to the supportive community culture of Sancta, as evidenced through application and appropriate references

Preference is given to a student of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander identity. Documentation can be submitted directly to marketingdevelopment@sancta.edu.au at the same as residential or scholarship application.

Scholarship conditions:

- Maintain a sound academic record
- Remain enrolled in Bachelor's degree at The University of Sydney and remain a resident of Sancta Sophia College
- Continue to contribute to College life through genuine participation and involvement

Mary Smoker is a Sancta alumna and retired pharmacist. She wishes to support a student to study at The University of Sydney and live at Sancta, acknowledging the excellent experience she had as a student here. Understanding that financial circumstances is a common barrier, she wants to support a student who would otherwise not have access the opportunity to live at Sancta.

Archbishop of Sydney Scholarship for academically talented undergraduate Catholic women

Scholarship value:

- 100% remission of residential fees annually
- Tenable for up to three years (subject to review of student progress each semester)

Scholarship criteria:

- Commencing female undergraduate who identifies as Catholic
- Excellent results in the Higher School Certificate (or equivalent)
- Undertaking a Bachelor degree at The University of Sydney
- Evidence through appropriate references of all-round involvement and leadership in school, community and parish
- Evidence of high achievement in sporting and/or cultural areas such (eg. social justice)
- Financial need

Scholarship conditions:

The progress of the recipient will be reviewed each semester and is subject to cancellation where requirements are not being met. To continue to receive the scholarship, the student must:

- Remain enrolled on a full-time basis in a degree at The University of Sydney
- Maintain a Distinction average

- Continue to reside at Sancta Sophia College
- Actively support liturgical and social justice activities at Sancta (including attending weekly Sunday afternoon Mass at Sancta)

This is a full scholarship awarded for up to three years to a student commencing a University of Sydney undergraduate degree. This scholarship is offered every second year. This scholarship is awarded to a Catholic entrant to College on the basis of excellent results in the Higher School Certificate (or equivalent); high achievement in sporting and/or cultural areas; evidence through appropriate references of all-round involvement and leadership in school, community and parish; and consideration of financial circumstances. Continuation of the scholarship is dependent on achieving a distinction average.

Gwen Kennedy Entrance Scholarship for medical students who will lead and inspire

Scholarship value:

- \$2,500 remission of residential fees per year
- Tenable during the time that the student remains at Sancta Sophia College; subject to review each semester

Scholarship criteria:

- Commencing female or male student at postgraduate level
- Undertaking a medical degree
- Excellent academic record in undergraduate degree
- Demonstrated commitment and ability to contribute to the College community
- Financial need

Scholarship conditions:

- Maintain a Distinction average (or equivalent)
- Remain enrolled in medical degree
- Continue to contribute to the Sancta community through genuine participation and involvement

Gwen Kennedy, an alumna of Sancta, was an eminent gynaecologist and obstetrician and practiced medicine under her maiden name, Gerrard until retiring at the age of 81. She was at Sancta all her university student days and she graduated in 1936. Gwen was very pleased that her two daughters and only granddaughter also attended the College.

Gwen Kennedy's family maintain strong ties to Sancta and generously support the continuation of the Gwen Kennedy Scholarship.

Joint University of Sydney & Sancta Sophia College Sporting Scholarships for students with talent in Sport

Sancta Sophia College sports scholarships are designed to support sportsmen and women at the College. The College matches a sports scholarship provided by the University of Sydney Sports & Fitness (SUSF) through their Elite Athlete Program by up to \$2,000 per year.
